

"Weed And Seed" Progam Coming To Waikiki



Several high-profile violent crimes and an increase in post covid thefts have raised concerns for public safety in the Waikīkī community.

A virtual town hall meeting organized by Honolulu City Council Chair Tommy Waters to address public safety and homelessness featured presentations by Honolulu Police Major Randall Platt, the Waikīkī District 6 Commander, Jennifer Nakayama, President of the Waikīkī Business Improvement District Association and Honolulu City Prosecutor Steve Alm.

Alm focused on the multiagency program called "Weed and Seed". The initiative intends to "weed out" criminals from a particular area and then "seed" the community by introducing social and economic programs. "Weed and Seed" has led to many arrests in Chinatown and Kalihi-Palama while providing services such as substance abuse treatment and housing to help get people off the streets.

"Now we want to bring that strategy to Waikīkī," said Alm. He said the process begins with a community assessment of the problems/issues affecting the community. Council Chair Tommy Waters included \$100,000 in the 2022-23 city budget to bring Weed and Seed to Waikīkī.

Hawaii Lodging and Tourism Association President and CEO Mufi Hannemann said, "Waikīkī businesses

and social service partners such as Adult Friends for Youth are ready to provide support when the program comes to the district."

Waters said he will follow up with another town hall meeting in a few months. In the meantime, he said, people should email safety and security concerns to Waikikiconcerns@honolulu.gov or to tommy.waters@honolulu.gov. "Email us things like hot spots, where we need added police. One of them could be more lighting in Waikīkī — things of that nature," he said. "We're going to compile that while we work on the 'Weed and Seed."

Alm said public input and support is essential to the success of the program, and asked Waikiki residents, businesses, visitors and workers "to tell us about the problems."

Rick Egged, Waikīkī Improvement Association President, said he believes from his conversations with HPD, that "Weed and Seed" will help with charging and sentencing Waikīkī offenders.

"Weed and Seed"

A multiagency program and initiative that intends to "weed out" criminals from a particular area and then "seed" the community by introducing social and economic programs.

Though "Weed and Seed" has not yet come to Waikīkī, Alm said his office is working with HPD "to identify those thieves who are stealing our stores in Waikīkī blind."

Alm has said that his office has been charging serial property offenders with habitual property crime, a Class C felony punishable by up to five years in prison.

"So far, some of the folks arrested for that include Lawrence Smalls, who had 161 prior convictions with zero consequences, Jacob Aukai, Robert Narito Jr., Yolanda Pusi and most recently Anthony Kornegay."

He said the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney also has been seeking stiffer penalties for those who commit violence against seniors by using Act 147, which makes intentionally or knowingly causing bodily injury to anyone age 60 or older a Class C felony.

Last week an Oahu jury found Mackenzie Barefoot, 28, guilty of second-degree assault for beating a senior security guard at a COVID-19 testing site at the Tom Moffatt Waikiki Shell in November.

Waikiki Beach Special Improvement District Annual Report



This year has been a productive year for beach improvements in Waikīkī. With a new Royal Hawaiian groin and a newly replenished beach, Waikīkī Beach is in good shape for the anticipated visitor industry recovery. The Waikīkī Beach Special Improvement District Association (WBSIDA) has been utilizing the economic down-turn of 2021-22 as time of renewal and rejuvenation of Waikīkī Beach while also working with State partners on the development on longer-term beach improvement plans. The WBSIDA also partnered with the state to complete the Waikīkī Beach Maintenance project in May, 2021 ahead of schedule with an expedited construction timeframe. The focus of 2022 has been planning for longer-term beach improvement projects. The WBSIDA has spent the last four years in partnership with the Department of Land and Natural Resources developing an Environmental Impact Statement, (EIS) for Waikīkī Beach that identifies potential beach improvements that will serve Hawai'i for generations to come. We expect the Final EIS to be completed in the summer, 2022 and the onset of the proposed beach improvement project permits by the end of the year. We look forward to major beach improvements as a result of the EIS effort and expect some of these projects to come to fruition possibly in 2023-24.

Waikīkī Beach Special District

Fiscal Year 2021-22 is the seventh year of operation for the WBSIDA. Created by Revised Ordinance of Honolulu (ROH 15-11), signed into law May 18, 2015 and taking effect July 1, 2015, the purpose of the District is to provide for and finance supplemental services and improvements in and to Waikīkī Beach as authorized by Chapter 36, ROH. Under the ordinance, a private non-profit entity was formed to govern the Special Improvement District. The WBSIDA is governed by a Board of Directors and an Executive Committee directed by representatives of Waikīkī property owners, other stakeholders and by state and county government designees. Waikīkī Beach Special Improvement District #3 (the WBSIDA District) includes all the commercial properties of Waikīkī, bounded by Kapahulu Avenue, the Ala Wai Canal and the Ala Wai Harbor.




Figure 1. WBSIDA Assessment rate.




Figure 2. WBSIDA Assessment Revenue (2016-2024).




Figure 4. WBSIDA Special Projects Budget for 2022-23

For the upcoming fiscal year 2022-23 (July to June), the special district assessment rate was increased to 6.90 cents per \$1000 of assessed value (\$0.069/\$1000) up from 6.58 cents per \$1000 of assessed value (\$0.0658/\$1000) (Figure 1). This is the first year the assessment rate has increased since the initial creation of the district in 2015. Increasing the assessment rate is necessary in order to budget for upcoming major improvement projects in Waikīkī Beach, and due to the covid-related downturn in the assessment income as reflected in the 2022-23 operational budget and assessment income (Figure 2). The annual operating budget for the WBSIDA is \$949,514 for the upcoming fiscal year starting in July, 2022 (Figure 3). This funding supports six separate projects facilitated by the WBSIDA (Figure 4).

Figure 3. WBSIDA Approved Operating Budget for 2022-23


