Unreasonable Noise in Waikiki

Waikiki Neighborhood Board Chair, Bob Finley and Waikiki Improvement Association (WIA) President Rick Egged met with Mayor Rick Blangiardi, Managing Director Michael Formby Waikiki HPD Major Randell Platt, City Council Chair Tommy Waters and the Prosecuting Attorney's office regarding the mayor's veto of Bill 43 Relating to Amplified Sound in Waikiki. The mayor's veto was based on recommendations of the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney (Prosecutor's Office) and the Honolulu Police Department (HPD). Bill 43 as written was unenforceable. The purpose of Bill 43 was "to preserve the tranquility of Waikiki against noise disturbances by regulating amplified sound from public property..."



The Honolulu Police Department and the Prosecuting Attorney's office proposed a focused effort to enforce existing law pertaining to Disorderly Conduct (HRS 711-1101). The law states that "A person commits the offense of disorderly conduct if, with intent to cause physical inconvenience or alarm by a member or members of the public, or recklessly creating a risk thereof, the person: ... (b) Makes unreasonable noise; The above offense of disorderly conduct was punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment of not more than 1 year, or both."

HPD believes that most of the resident and visitor concerns regarding noise can be addressed by this law. The recommendation of the Mayor and the City team was to make a determined effort to enforce the Disorderly Conduct (HRS 711-1101) law. HPD pledged their support. All residents and business experiencing adverse noise impacts are urged to call 911 and report the problem to HPD. Please make WIA aware of your complaint as well, at mail@waikikiimprovement.com.

HCC Kicks Off 2023 With First Sporting Tournament

The Hawai'i Convention Center (HCC) welcomed hundreds of youth participants from around the world to the Fifth Annual TransPacific Volleyball Championships (TPVC) on Jan. 14.

The three-day event, an international, high-level volleyball competition, and college showcase included more than 2,000 athletes and 226 teams from Hawai'i, the mainland U.S., China, Canada, Mexico, American Samoa, Thailand, New Zealand, and more. It is the largest indoor sporting event held in Hawaii.

The TPVC, sponsored by the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU), is one of the many such functions held each year at the HCC since 2017 when it invested \$1.1 million to lure more sports events to the venue. The funds allowed HCC to purchase fully portable sports courts, which can be configured simultaneously to stage up to 28 regulation volleyball or badminton matches, 18 high school basketball games, or 11 indoor soccer courts.

The Center is also looking forward to welcoming other sports events throughout the year including the Aloha Region Volleyball Tournaments, Destiny MMA, All Star Cheerleaders and more.
