

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NEW NIGHTLY BEACH CLOSURES AT THE ROYAL HAWAIIAN BEACH

WAIKĪKĪ BEACH NEWS AND UPDATES | March, 2023 Update

In an effort to address illegal activity, public health and safety and respond to community concerns the Waikīkī Beach Special Improvement District Association (WBSIDA) in partnership with the Honolulu Police Department have initiated an overnight beach closure of the Royal Hawaiian Beach (RHB). This measure is intended to address significant public health and safety issues that have developed as a result of overnight sleeping and storage of personal items on the beach. Nightly beach closure of the RHB from the Royal Hawaiian Groin to Kuhio Beach from 2am to 5am is consistent with the City and County of Honolulu nightly beach closure of adjacent Kuhio Beach park.

The issue of overnight sleeping, camping and storage of personal items has accelerated in the last twelve months in the RHB area. Hotels and beach concession operators in the area have observed an increase in overnight sleeping and personal storage activity on the beach. These activities have also resulted in increased user conflicts, threats of violence and trash and food items being rummaged through and disposed of on the beach and around the trash receptacles. The lack of meaningful enforcement of overnight sleeping and storage may have enabled this behavior and appears to be increasing.

The WBSIDA convened three stakeholder meetings in January and February of 2022. Those meetings identified the need for consistent hours and consistent enforcement. As a result of the ongoing problems in the area, the Waikīkī Neighborhood Board passed a resolution at the monthly Board meeting on February 8, 2022 identifying these same concerns and supporting efforts to provide overnight beach closure hours from 2am to 5am daily. The WBSIDA Board of Directors also unanimously agreed to and approved the proposed nightly beach closure at the April 28, 2022 Board Meeting.

- 1. Beach Closure Hours. Nightly beach closure of the RHB from the Royal Hawaiian Groin to Kuhio Beach from 2am to 5am. These hours are consistent with the City and County of Honolulu nightly beach closure of adjacent Kuhio Beach park as well as beach closure hours at Fort DeRussy Beach and administered by the DLNR DOBOR.
- 2. Effective Date. The beach closure will be effective starting March 3, 2023.
- 3. Transiting. Allow transiting through the area to access the ocean or walking through along the beach.
- 4. No Loitering. No loitering, standing, sitting, lying down or storage of personal items would be allowed during the beach closure hours.
- 5. Beach Cleaning Exemption: Authorized beach cleaning and related maintenance operations are exempt from the beach closure hours.
- 6. Enforcement. With the new beach closure hours, enforcement would be conducted jointly through the Honolulu Police Department (HPD) and/or the DLNR Division of Conservation and Resource Enforcement (DOCARE).
- 7. Outreach. The WBSIDA, in partnership with Waikīkī stakeholders, intends to conduct community and stakeholder outreach to ensure awareness of the planned beach closure hours. The planned outreach includes the following:
 - a. Permanent signage on the beach of the closure hours. (Complete)
 - b. Outreach to the Waikīkī Aloha Ambassadors, Neighborhood Board and elected official in the district. (In-Progress)
 - c. WBSIDA, Waikīkī Improvement Association and WBID Board of Directors meetings and newsletters to members. (Complete)
 - d. Notification to City Council and relevant City government departments (Complete).
 - e. News release to local media (Complete)
 - f. Community meeting(s). (In-Progress)

The Kūhiō Beach Hula Show is Back!

The Kūhiō Beach Hula Show, a Waikiki fixture for over 30 years, is a cultural series of performances that encompass authentic Hawaiian chanting, hula and song, providing a true cultural experience for the visitor. It occurs at the Kūhiō Beach Hula Mound which consists of a stage permanent seating on a well-manicured lawn, landscaping, and lighting. The hula mound (pā hula) was dedicated solely for the use of hula in a Hawaiian ceremony in 2002.

The Kūhiō Beach Hula Show is the only all-Hawaiian, free hula show in Waikīkī which takes place in a non-commercial, public setting. The show is held from 6:30 to 7:30p.m. on Tuesdays and Saturdays. During the winter months (Nov-Dec-Jan) the ceremony is held from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. The show has one of the most beautiful backdrops in the world ... Waikīkī at sunset on the ocean's edge. The show is popular with visitors



and kama`aina (residents) alike and is known around the world. Many visitors report it is on their list of "must-sees" for their Hawaii vacation.



Content is exclusively Hawaiian, with music from live musicians. The performance opens each night with the pū kani (conch shell herald) by Likeke Bell. The show includes both hula kahiko (ancient) and hula `auana (modern.) Some shows include a hula lesson for the audience, special requests, birthdays and anniversaries, and other ways to interact with visitors. Photos are encouraged, and visitors are invited to come up and say hi after the show. No show is the same, but all are fully Hawaiian, inclusive, educational & entertaining.

Narration during performances gives story backgrounds, explanation of myth or legend, importance of wahi pana (significant places), the monarchy, meaning of motions, as well as translations, offering a depth of experience in Hawaiian history, culture and language.

All presenters are local cultural practitioners for whom hula and Hawaiian music and chant play a major role in their lives. An important mission of the Kūhiō Beach Hula Show is to foster respect, understanding and appreciation for authentic Hawaiian culture. It is presented by trained kumu hula and their haumana (students) who have a personal commitment to hula as an intrinsic part of their lives.

Some of Hawaii's most beloved mo'olelo (stories) involve the Menehune, a group of small people who lived hidden in the forests and valleys of the islands before Hawai'i was settled by Polynesians. 

We Move Brands Off Shelves & Into Hearts

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Hawai'i Convention Center **Unveils Two New Hawaiian Cultural Exhibits**





The public displays explore featherwork pieces by **Rick San Nicolas and The Healer Stones of Kapaemahu**

The Hawai'i Convention Center recently unveiled two new Hawaiian cultural exhibits on its third floor - an extensive Hawaiian featherwork installation available to the public for two years, and a new permanent display exploring The Healer Stones of Kapaemahu.



The Pūali'ahu Feather Cape Exhibit on the mauka side of the Center's third floor between Rooms 302 and 306 features several feather capes, a feathered helmet, and lei pāpale. All featherwork is handmade by master featherworker Rick San Nicolas using traditional Hawaiian techniques. This includes a cape designed by Rick San Nicolas for Princess Ka'iulani made of peacock feathers, a replica of a feather cape worn by Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalaniana'ole, and a replica of a cloak worn by Pi'ilani, an ancient high chief of the Kingdom of Maui.The display also showcases 'ahu kaua, or battle cloaks, which are rarely seen in exhibit.

In addition, the Center is displaying replicas of The Healer Stones of Kapaemahu outside Theater 320, following a recent installation at the Bishop Museum. The original stones, which are a public monument on Kalakaua Avenue near the Duke Kahanamoku statue, honor four legendary māhū – individuals who embody both male and female spirit – who brought healing arts from Tahiti to Hawaii many centuries ago. The display is accompanied by historic photographs, large artistic painted representations of the healers, and an 8-minute, Academy Award-shortlisted animated film.


