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Waikiki Public Access Project


A Senate Bill (SB3354) has been introduced that appropriates funds for a capital improvement project to the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) to plan, design and reconstruct a public beach access route between Fort DeRussy Beach and the Royal Hawaiian Beach, Waikīkī. This legislation is being spearheaded by Senator Moriwaki who represents Senate District #12 which includes Waikīkī.

The proposed actions to design a new public accessway will greatly improve access to Waikīkī's public beaches and greatly reduce the vulnerability of this portion of Waikīkī to coastal hazards and sea level rise complementing the planned beach improvements in this area. The need for a dedicated public access (boardwalk) is critical to overall improvement of this beach area. Even if the proposed beach improvements do occur it will still limit access to those that can transit over the sand and will not benefit those with limited mobility since the current walkway is discontinuous and requires traversing the beach in sections.



Stakeholders of the Waikiki community can speak to the urgent need for improved public access in this area based on the current shoreline condition of the proposed project area. Changing coastal conditions and beach erosion have deteriorated existing public infrastructure such as seawall walkways, creating hazardous conditions for both resident and visitor pedestrians in the Waikiki region. In areas where the walkways have not yet collapsed, the walkway is narrow, inaccessible to those who cannot use stairs, and is often overtopped by sand and crashing waves creating an extremely hazardous environment.

Without safe lateral shoreline access, the east and west portions of Waikiki's waterfront are discontinuous and a large segment of the beach known as the Halekulani-Kawehewehe Beach Sector is inaccessible from the shoreline, which is the predominant way that visitors typically transit along this



portion of Waikiki Beach. The poor condition of this area inhibits the flow of pedestrians along the coast and between the streets and sidewalks and the other businesses that serve both visitors and local residents in the area.

A proposed beach improvement project by the DLNR is also currently under regulatory review. The proposed Waikīkī <u>Beach improvement and maintenance projects</u> are an essential component to the overall resilience of this critically important area. The proposed project in the Halekulani sector of Waikīkī is critical to mitigate the forecast impacts of sea-level rise as well as the observed beach loss and coastal inundation already being experienced on a more frequent basis in Waikīkī. The proposed public access and planned Waikīkī Beach Improvements are very compatible and can both be accomplished on separate but coordinated timeframes.

The bill provides a way to improve public safety, restore access, regenerate connections and revitalize the character and public use in this area of the community, and also to serve as an example of how our region can incorporate sea level rise and coastal hazards into planning and adaptation processes moving forward. One of the most innovative and important aspects of this effort is the proposal to develop a stakeholder driven design process by conducting extensive community engagement, incorporate innovative research on climate adaptation from the University of Hawaii, include local design and engineering firms, collaborate with numerous Waikiki stakeholders on a mutually beneficial project.
