

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Waikiki Resilience & Sea Level Rise Adaptation Project

WAIKĪKĪ BEACH NEWS AND UPDATES




The State of Hawaii has kicked off a new resilience planning initiative in Waikiki, the Waikīkī Resilience and Sea Level Rise Adaptation Project (WRAP). The \$350,000 project is funded by the State Office of Planning and Sustainable Development, which awarded the University of Hawai'i Community Design Center (UHCDC) and its project partner Hawai'i Sea Grant. The University of Hawaii Sea Grant College Program (Hawaii Sea Grant) coordinated and conducted three initial community stakeholder events through the month of December, 2023.

These outreach meetings were designed to support the development of a resilience framework for a subsequent adaption plan and to identify needs, gaps and opportunities for community resilience, potential adaptation pathways, triggers and phases for Waikīkī. A total of 95 people attended the WRAP outreach meetings. Each of the Stakeholder and Community Outreach meetings were held virtually through Zoom and the December 11, 2023 Community meeting was held as a hybrid meeting (Zoom and in-person). Additional community outreach and engagement is being planned for this Spring.

a future Waikīkī adaptation and resilience plan. The WRAP consists of several overlapping phases of research, analysis, outreach and adaptation community visioning. These efforts are sequential in nature and provide the framework and background for follow on work involving proof of concept designs, pilot projects and technical, economic and feasibility studies to facilitate a future adaptation plan for Waikīkī. The next phase of the project will include community visioning of adaptation through design charrettes of adaptive re-design for Waikīkī. The WRAP will conclude with a final report to the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development in mid-2024. Subsequent resilience planning efforts are expected to follow the completion of the initial phase of the Waikiki Resilience and Adaptation Project.

The WRAP aims to establish the framework, goals and collaborative opportunities for a subsequent, long-term (50 - 100 years) resilience and adaptation plan for Waikīkī that is centered on community values and priorities. The WRAP project outcome is to facilitate the development of an adaptation plan for Waikiki as part of a subsequent stage. As a site-specific adaptation plan, it will be the first of its kind in Hawaii and is meant to demonstrate an adaptation planning framework model for other Hawaii communities.

The City and County of Honolulu's Department of Planning and Permitting is also initiating a nearly \$400,000 pilot project to study the impacts of climate change and sea level rise on Waikiki, the "Adapt Waikiki 2050." This City-lead effort is separate from but is highly coordinated with the WRAP and is being carried out by three local consulting and engineering firms. The City's Adapt Waikiki 2050 differs from the State WRAP in both scope and timeframe and is just beginning the public outreach portion of this effort which will be ongoing over the next two years.
