U.S. Army Corps of Engineers recommends major changes to Ala Wai Flood Risk Management Project

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) announced that they are recommending changes to the \$345 million Ala Wai Flood Risk Management Project (The Project), including removal of two huge basins planned for Pukele and Waiomao streams and improving the system above Manoa Marketplace to increase protection for the University of Hawaii at Mānoa and lower Honolulu neighborhoods.

Over the past year the USACE has been gathering data and listening to the community regarding the Ala Wai Flood Risk Management Project. Jeffrey Herzog, the project's manager, clarified that while the USACE seeks to address community concerns whenever possible, the changes to the Ala Wai Flood Risk Control design plans were based on new scientific data and analysis. The USACE advises that with community input they will make basic and fundamental changes and modifications to "The Project". It is designed to protect Honolulu neighborhoods including the University Of Hawai'i at Mānoa, Mo'ili'ili, McCully and Waiklkl from a catastrophic rain-fed flood.

Supporters fear that the next big storm disaster could put people's life at risk and create billions of dollars of damage to Mānoa, Palolo, Makiki and Waikīkī but some residents have expressed opposition and have filed a lawsuit to stop the project.

31st Annual TALK STORY FESTIVAL, Öctober 11, FREE Waikīkī Community Center: Highlights from Waikīkī lights The city and state have signed an agreement outlining a funding plan and path forward for working with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to establish flood control measures along the Ala Wai Watershed.

Most residents understand what could happen with a major storm disaster but remain cautious until they see the final design plan.

The Corps of Engineers said that based on community input, it would recommend removing all detention basins in Palolo from the plans.

The changes include removing the Makiki detention basin adjacent to the Hālau Ku Mana campus.

In Mānoa, no large dams would be added in exchange for removing the ones in Makiki and Pālolo. Based on the updated hydrological modeling of the seven Mānoa sub-watersheds, the modifications recommend smaller multiple green infrastructure features. (low-impact system of natural flood storage in green spaces, diversion channels, bypass channels, etc.) The Canal Area flood protection will be extended from the

Ala Wai Canal up to Date Street (protecting 'Iolani School

and Ala Wai Elementary)

Herzog said that while the original feasibility study called for earthen detention basins in upper Pālolo and Makiki, more recent analysis found that focusing on streams in Mānoa Valley will be a more efficient and cost-effective approach to flood mitigation for the lower Ala Wai watershed.

Herzog said that they are planning another round of community and stake holder meetings that would culminate in a large public meeting. He anticipates at least 6 to 9 months of public meetings and scientific review before design plans will be solidified.

Feedback regarding features around the Ala Wai Canal and in Manoa will also be incorporated.

State and federal officials continue to support "The Project". U.S. Sen. Brian Schatz issued a statement Friday saying he was pleased to see the Corps listening to community concerns in modifying the project.

"We still have a long way to go. This will require that we rebuild trust and listen to each other, but this is nevertheless good news for all involved. This will help us to honor our commitment to keep people in the Ala Wai watershed safe from flood risk in the era of climate change," he said.



Honolulu Mayor Kirk Caldwell has said the local share of funding could come from the state with the issuance of \$125 million in "certificate of participation bonds". The federal government would foot \$220 million for its share of the costs.

By email, Gov. David Ige spokesperson Cindy McMillan said while the decision to proceed with the project is the city's, "the Governor's position remains the same -- he supports The Project, and the state is willing to provide major financial backing for it."

Līlia Waikīkī groundbreaking

A blessing and groundbreaking ceremony for Līlia Waikīkī took place on September 10. 2019. Līlia Waikīkī is a vibrant mixed-use development in the heart of Waikīkī, Hawaiʻi's most well-known destination for retail, lodging, dining and commercial entertainment. The stunning 28-story residential tower, with over 400 units and 40.000 sf of retail space is the first high rise, Class-A rental tower built in Waikīkī in over 20 years. Named to honor Queen Emma's legacy, Līlia Waikīkī is aimed to reflect the need to protect the environment and preserve the Hawaiian culture.

Developers from Brookfield Properties gathered at the future site of Līlia Waikīkī located at 2370 Kūhiō Avenue for the blessing. Līlia Waikīkī will be the first new "for rent" apartment development built in decades meeting the high demand for rental housing in the Waikīkī neighborhood. "Lilia Waikiki will put local residents at the center of the revitalized Kuhio Avenue district," said Kris Hui, Vice President of mixed-use development for Brookfield Properties. In addition, 53 units will be renovated in an existing low-rise building across the street on Kanekapolei. The development will include retail space, which will be anchored by a two-story grocery called, Waikiki Market, operated by the Food Pantry, Ltd.

The Waikīkī Improvement Association's 2019 Annual Meeting will honor the 2019 Ho'owehiwehi Award Winners!

The nominations for consideration for the Waikīkī Improvement Association's 2019 Annual Ho'owehiwehi Awards are in! The awards are to be presented at the WIA Annual Meeting on Wednesday, October 23, 2019 at the Alohilani Resort Waikiki Beach.

The Ho'owehiwehi awards have been presented since 2001 to recognized projects and programs that enhance Waikīkī to adorn, decorate or beautify.

This year there are 11 nominations in 4 categories:

"HANA NUI AWARD"

This award is aimed at NEW or MAJOR reconstruction, development or transformation projects. It recognizes a company, organization or group for its significant contribution toward the enduring revitalization of Waikīkī's physical, cultural and/or economic environment. There are four nominations: The Ritz-Carlton Residences Waikiki Beach-Diamond Head Tower; The Waikiki Beachcomber by Outrigger; The Espacio, The Jewel of Waikiki; and Hale Koa Hotel's Aquatics Complex.

"HANA IKI AWARD"

This Award is aimed at renovation projects that enhance structures or facilities. There are three nominations: The Island Vintage Wine Bar at Royal Hawaiian Center; Hale Koa's Maile Tower Renovation; and ABC Store at the Royal Hawaiian Center

"PILI HONUA AWARD"

This award recognizes green, earth friendly projects or people, along with hotel operations, that embody the goals and aspirations of living GREEN in Hawai'i to help preserve our precious 'āina and save our valuable resources. There are two nominations this year: **Embassy Suites Waikiki** and the **Hale Koa Hotel's Green Projects and Operations.**

"THE DR. GEORGE S. KANAHELE AWARD"

This award recognizes historian Dr. George S. Kanahele who was the driving force to restore a sense of "Hawaiianness" to Waikīkī. He founded the Native Hawaiian Hospitality Association. Hiroshima Band reunites for one-night, 40th anniversary concert

Legendary band Hiroshima brings its distinctive, cross-genre, multi-generational music for a one-night only reunion concert in the venerable Monarch Room at <u>The Royal Hawaiian</u>, a <u>Luxury Collection Resort</u> on **Saturday, October 12 at 8 p.m.**

The concert will feature founder Dan Kuramoto, and original members June Kuramoto, Danny Yamamoto and Hawaii's own Kimo Cornwell; plus current members Dean Cortez and Land Richards. The concert will also include a performance by a special guest that evening. Hiroshima was formed in 1974 by Dan Kuramoto and has been nominated for several Grammy Awards for its vibrant, intoxicating mix of traditional Japanese folk music interwoven with jazz, R&B, salsa and more. 
O'ahu Visitors Bureau announces new director of marketing and new sales manager
