

Outrigger Names Dr. Charles R. Kelley Board Chair

Dr. Richard R. Kelley named Chairman Emeritus; David Carey continues leading company as President and CEO

Richard R. Kelley, M.D., Board Chairman of [Outrigger Enterprises Group, Inc.](#), since 1986, announced today that the family-owned company's board of directors has accepted his initiative to step aside as Chairman in favor of his son, Charles Roy "Chuck" Kelley, M.D. W. David P. Carey III continues as Outrigger's President and Chief Executive Officer. Richard Kelley now assumes the role of Chairman Emeritus. The changes took effect immediately following the board's meeting on August 4. The board comprises four family members, including the two Drs. Kelley and Carey, and four outside directors.


"After 25 years as Chairman, I felt it was time to follow the example of my father (company founder Roy C. Kelley) and continue the evolution of our company's leadership by passing the reins to the next generation. However, no one should imagine I'm retiring," said the 77-year-old Kelley, who has long maintained a whirlwind schedule of meetings, nationwide speaking engagements, leadership involvement on professional and nonprofit boards, writing and international travel.

"I plan to keep doing most of what I've been doing since stepping down as CEO in 1993," said the new Chairman Emeritus, "but I'm asking Chuck to take over the considerable governance work involved in chairing the board.

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Outrigger's management remains in the proven, capable hands of David Carey. David has brilliantly led the transition that I began from the successful mom-and-pop business my parents created to one of the Asia-Pacific region's largest, fastest-growing, privately held hospitality companies. He has also led our highly successful and continuing energetic expansion from Waikiki to the neighbor islands, the Pacific and Asia."

Kelley noted Outrigger's tradition of generally keeping the role of chairman separate from those of president and CEO, beginning when he gradually assumed day-to-day management of the company from Roy Kelley in the late 1960s, while his father remained Chairman. "I know that Chuck will bring his characteristically thoughtful, analytical approach to his new role," said Kelley, "and that he will also carry on the important Outrigger tradition, begun by my parents Roy and Estelle, which I have also attempted to maintain, of keeping in close personal touch with our employees, from housekeeping and engineering on up to the executive suite."

"Dr. Kelley has earned a legendary reputation in our company, in our community and in our industry," said Carey, "and I'm reassured to know he has no plans to slow down anytime soon. It's impossible to overstate the value of the experience, wisdom and clarity of thought he brings to the leadership of our company. I have no doubt he's going to redefine the image of the emeritus role."

Carey continued, "I've greatly enjoyed working with Chuck on a wide range of strategic issues since he joined the company 11 years ago. He's been an invaluable partner on the board of directors and in overseeing our separate Advisory Board of Directors, which formulates and conveys the extended Kelley family's input to the company leadership. Chuck always takes a very thoughtful approach, he's inherited his father's instinctive concern for what employees are thinking and what they care about, and he's honed the practice of management-by-walking-around to a fine art. His high-touch, hands-on, ohana-oriented approach, combined with his wide-ranging expertise and experience, is ideally suited to the role of Chairman."

In addition to his new role as Chairman, Dr. Chuck Kelley continues to serve as Outrigger's Vice President for the KF Development Group, which has oversight responsibility for the company's Advisory Board of Directors and a range of investor-related services for owners of the company and its affiliates. Activities of the KFD Group include financial management, tax planning and investment monitoring. Dr. Chuck Kelley works in a variety of roles in human resources and risk management, leveraging his master's degree in public health.

"I'm honored – and humbled – to take on the responsibilities of Chairman," said "Dr. Chuck," as Outrigger employees familiarly call him. "My dad is a tough act to follow, and I'm glad he's planning to remain actively engaged – hyperactively is probably a better word for the way he lives and works – for a long time to come. I'm going to rely on him and David for their wisdom and leadership as we continue to evolve and expand the Outrigger brand of hospitality."

At last year's performance, he brought with him a special guest to perform a few numbers with him, Yoko Hizuki. Born in Kobe, Ms. Hizuki joined Mamoru Miyagi's studio in 2008. Prior to falling in love with Okinawa, Hizuki performed with other bands in Japan and been a regular host of the Hai Sai Kobe weekly show on Radio Kansai. She's on stage right after Mamoru Miyagi on Saturday and Sunday at 4:30 pm.

Leinani Hula Group

The last time our audience enjoyed Leinani Hula Group was back in 2007 at the 25th Okinawan Festival. A contingent of Okinawan dancers who have learned the art of hula, they will share their talent on Saturday, September 3 at 12:30 pm.

Kyoko Toma Family Minyou Group & Yuino Buyo Group

On Sunday, September 4 from 3:00 pm, two groups will perform for the first time in Hawaii. Kyoko Toma Family Minyou Group, a family uta - sanshin group lead by Kyoko Toma on Sanshin, her daughter Sumika Miyagi on taiko, her granddaughters Madoka Miyagi, age 10 and Shieru Miyagi, age 6, on Sanshin. This delightful group performs at various festivals and events in Okinawa. Closing out the segment, enjoy minbu dance by Yuino Buyo Group, led by Kiyoshi Miyagi. Minbu style of dance is unique in that it combines minyou folk style with classical buyo style of dance.

Taco Rice - a dish invented in Okinawa which combines the main ingredients of the Tex - Mex taco, but layered on a bed of rice. Taco Rice is served in izakaya, independent restaurants and fast food chains throughout Okinawa and in certain areas of mainland Japan. Taco Rice will be available on Saturday and Sunday as a small meal, perfect for "grazers" who want to taste a little bit of everything at festivals.

Fundagi - a special blend of andagi batter, it is spin - off of funnel cake, lightly dusted with powdered sugar. Only available at the Saturday Bon Dance.

Pig Feet Soup - pig's feet cooked in soup stock and garnished with seaweed, turnip, squash and mustard cabbage

Yakisoba - stir - fried Okinawan style soba noodles with vegetable and luncheon meat

Okinawa Soba - Okinawan style soba noodles served in hot soup and garnished with fishcake, shoyu pork, green onions and red ginger

Champururu Plate - shoyu pork, stir - fried vegetables, luncheon meat and deep - fried tofu

Okidog - a hot dog and chili are wrapped in a soft tortilla with shredded shoyu pork and lettuce

Andagi - Okinawan deep fried donut

Andadog - Okinawan version of the corndog. A hot dog on a stick that is dipped into Andagi batter and deep fried *and more!*

The free app is available for [download on iTunes](#) for iPhone, iPod and iPad devices.

Search by Category

The four most popular categories featured at the bottom of the homepage are: Hawaiian, Arts & Music, Cuisine and Sports. The user may select one of these categories or choose "More" to see the full range of categories.

The 12 categories are:

Hawaiian: Hula, Hawaiian music and Hawaiian culture

Arts & Music: Concerts, art exhibits and shows

Cuisine: Food and wine events

Sports: Ocean and land activities

Ethnic Culture: Non-Hawaiian cultural events including Korean, Japanese, Chinese and more

Agriculture: Farmers' markets

Education: Seminars and conferences

Nature/Eco-Tourism: Plant shows and botanical garden tours

Signature Events: Hawai'i's most prominent festivals and parades

Health/Wellness: Spiritual and healing events

Technology: High-tech shows and events

The "Near Me" button pulls up and displays events closest to users based on their location in the Hawaiian Islands.

Event Profiles

Each profile includes a photo along with a brief description of the event. Selecting "Favorite" bookmarks the event, while Facebook and Twitter links enable users to share the event with friends.

GPS Capabilities

Selecting "Directions" will pull up Google maps so that the user can obtain directions to the event of choice.

"This app helps to simplify life for travelers who are looking for things to do in our islands," said HTA Tourism Brand Manager Michael Story. "As technology evolves, we will continue to look for new and innovative ways to deliver information to Hawai'i residents and visitors alike."

Hawai'i Convention Center Builds on Success of Global Outreach Leading up to APEC 2011 Leaders' Meeting In November

The Hawai'i Convention Center continues to strengthen its international outreach program, assisting U.S. associations in promoting meetings to thousands of participants globally, and tapping into growing interest from Korea, China and other areas in the Pacific Rim.

Capitalizing on Hawai'i's geographic position as the central meeting point between North America and Asia has resulted in an increase in global registration at the largest meetings held in Hawai'i. The Center will round out its highly successful 2010-2011 international outreach as Hawai'i prepares to host the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) 2011 Leaders' Meeting in November.

In the first half of 2011, the Center hosted three of its largest meetings of the year: The American Academy of Neurology's (AAN) 63rd-Annual Meeting in April; the American Psychiatric Association's (APA) 164th-Annual Meeting in May; and the Association for Asian Studies (AAS) and International Convention of Asia Scholars (ICAS) from March-April.

The American Academy of Neurology launched its most comprehensive international outreach campaign ever that for the first time included Japan, which made up nearly 3 percent of total international attendance, and China, with more than 4 percent of international attendance.

The meeting, from April 9-16, topped initial estimates with more than 10,000 participants, of which more than a third attended from 92 countries outside the U.S. The percentage of international attendees overall was 37 percent. AAN also saw participation double from several targeted countries, including Australia and China, and attendance from Japan rose 63 percent in 2011 from the year earlier.

"The Hawai'i Convention Center taught us how to do international outreach both culturally and from the point of view of an organization hoping to build attendance," said Catherine M. Rydell, CAE, Executive Director and CEO of the American Academy of Neurology. "We worked for three years with the Center on our international outreach program and strategy, and will now integrate these highly successful efforts into a national campaign for future meetings."

Specifically, AAN is using its work with the Hawai'i Convention Center as a model for its annual meeting in New Orleans in 2012, where it is targeting participation from South America.

Since 2009, the Center has worked with AAN to develop the organization's first-ever ambassador program, where key contacts were identified in China, Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand, Thailand and Korea to reach out to neurologists and neuroscientists in those countries. AAN assigned a staff member to work closely with the Center and the ambassadors.

In addition, specific micro-websites were created in different languages for each country, and the Center also helped promote the conference at various meetings and exhibitions.

The American Psychiatric Association drew more than 10,000 attendees throughout 76 countries from May 14-18, making it the Center's second-largest meeting of the year. More than 39 percent of the meeting's attendance traveled from outside the U.S.

"The success of the Center's new international outreach program, coupled with November's APEC 2011 Leaders' Meeting, helps solidify Hawai'i as a location of shared geographic convenience in which to do serious business," said Joe Davis, SMG general manager of the Hawai'i Convention Center. "This international participation greatly enhances the depth of these meetings and puts Hawai'i at the forefront of global research and discussions across a wide range of disciplines."

The Association for Asian Studies (AAS) and International Convention of Asia Scholars (ICAS) conference, held March 31-April 3 at the Center, exceeded previously expected attendance by 1,400 attendees, drawing 4,400 participants from 65 countries. To accommodate the increased size of the joint AAS-ICAS meeting, the event was held at a convention center for the first time.

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Other major international conferences at the Hawai'i Convention Center in 2011 have included the BMT Tandem Meetings from Feb. 17-21, with 2,400 attendees from 44 countries. Participation topped initial forecasts by more than 400 attendees. The American College of Chest Physicians (ACCP) annual meeting from Oct. 22-27 is also expected to draw hundreds of international participants.

The 19th APEC Leaders' Meeting, one of the world's largest intergovernmental meetings and the largest such gathering in Hawai'i's history, will host 21 member economies from Nov. 12-13. It is the first time the U.S. has hosted an APEC meeting since 1993.

Scientists to Examine Alien Species During American Phytopathological Society-International Association for Plant Protection Sciences Joint Meeting at Hawai'i Convention Center

More than 1,800 scientists from around the world will gather at the 2011 American Phytopathological Society (APS)-International Plant Protection Congress (IPPC) Joint Meeting from Aug. 6-10, at the Hawai'i Convention Center. The meeting will cover ground-breaking research on the spread of insects, weeds, and pathogens through global commercial trade, as well as tropical forest pathology and maintaining bio-security for crop production.

Meeting jointly for the first time in Hawai'i, The American Phytopathological Society and International Association for Plant Protection Science (IAPPS) are anticipating a record international attendance, including delegates from 55 countries. The meeting is expected to draw 1,800 attendees, including researchers, industry experts, educators, and policy makers working in agriculture and plant sciences.

Attendance is expected to top initial estimates by more than 600 participants. That translates into \$8.5 million in state revenue, with the Hawai'i Convention Center's hotel partners benefiting from nearly 14,500 room nights.

"We are so pleased to have our annual meeting in Hawai'i – a place with such natural diversity and exotic plant life," said John Sherwood, APS President. "Hawai'i offers a central location for a meeting focused on global issues and easy access for new attendees from the Pacific Rim and Asian countries."

The movement of insects, weeds, and pathogens around the world is having a profound impact on agriculture and natural resources. As trade opportunities grow, so does the possibility of introducing alien pests, which can threaten indigenous species unable to defend against such threats.

Plant pathologists – scientists who study plant diseases – have identified these issues and are searching for methods to combat invasive pests and species. Among those presenting at the meeting are Thomas Harrington, Iowa State University, and James Steadman, University of Nebraska, who will examine aspects of international protocols and efforts to develop better public policies. Roy Masamdu, SPC Land Resources Division, Fiji Islands, and Trevor Jackson, Lincoln Research Centre, New Zealand, will look at biological control of insect pests, plant pathogens, and invasive weeds specific to the Pacific Islands with the goal of reducing the impact of pesticides.

Other meeting highlights will include the discussion of:

- The management of diseases in tropical settings that threaten the health and survival of specific species of trees.
- The benefits of using biotechnology to provide a sustainable supply of food through the development of disease resistance traits in crop plants, including the transgenic papaya.

In addition, the meeting's plenary session will feature speakers who have a global perspective on changes in plant health and the challenges of feeding a growing population. Speakers include Roger Beachy, former director of the National Institute of Food and Agriculture; Elske van de Fliert, Center for Communication and Social Change at University of Queensland; Richard Tapia, Center for Excellence and Equity in Education, Rice University; and Robert Zeigler, International Rice Research Institute.

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“We are proud to welcome the APS-IPPC Joint Meeting to the Hawai‘i Convention Center,” said Joe Davis, SMG general manager of the Hawai‘i Convention Center. “The research presented at this meeting will greatly enhance the understanding of plant sciences and agriculture around the world.”

The APS Annual Meeting is the premier venue for plant scientists from around the world to share information and disseminate research.
